The Palisades, June 15th

Get Cool in June! The June meet will be held June 15, 2003, at the Palisades site on Mt. Lemmon. Nice & cool! Mike Franklin of the GPHXO club will be setting a two-hour Score-O. Come see how many controls you can bag. Meet directors are Pete and Judy Cowgill (520-887-1514). Give them a call if you can help for a few hours, or volunteer at the meet. **Carpooling recommended due to limited parking space.** Meet at Tanque Verde and Catalina Highway between 7:30 and 9:30 a.m. Also, there will be camping on Saturday night. Check the Tucson website or call Pete or Judy for further details on these matters.

Directions: Take Catalina Highway 19.8 miles to Organization Ridge Road (just before the Palisades Visitor Center). Turn left and, bearing right, go about 0.4 mile to the gate for Showers Point. Watch for the O signs.

Fees: \$5/individual, \$8/team, for members of any recognized orienteering club. \$10/individual, \$15/ team for nonmembers. Compasses rent for \$1. Safety whistles sell for \$1. Every person, all courses, all meets, is required to carry some type of safety whistle.

Newcomers: Go directly to Registration. Ask for instructions and introductory information. To attend the beginners' clinic, arrive between 8:30 and 8:45 a.m.

Schedule:

8:30 a.m. Registration opens.

8:45 a.m. Beginners' clinic starts.

9:00 a.m. Courses open.

11:00 a.m. Last time to start a course.

12 noon-1 p.m. Route choice reviews

1:00 p.m. Courses close. Begin control retrieval—good orienteering practice, lots of help always needed. Volunteer before 12 noon with the meet director.

Check-In: To insure that all are safe, everyone, whether finished with the course or not, must check in formally at Start/Finish before leaving the meet site.

Route-Choice Reviews: Between noon and 1 p.m., the course setter or an advanced orienteer will discuss route choices with returning participants, probably near Start/Finish area.

Need a Reason To Go To Seattle in July?

Seattle Night & Day is an urban team foot race with a strategy component. You choose your route to maximize your score by visiting checkpoints throughout Seattle and nearby Vashon Island for 3, 7, or 16 hours. The Cascade Orienteering Club hopes many of you will join them on July 19 for their region's second metrogaine, the Seattle Night & Day Navigation Challenge (www.seattlenightandday.com).

Checkpoints will be located at landmarks both famous and obscure, as well as scenic parks and rural areas. Your route will give you a tour of Seattle at its best. Expect the daytime to be sunny and dry -- though rain can *never* be ruled out -- the dusk to be late and long, and the night to be cool, with a half moon after midnight. A feast awaits you upon your return from the 7 or 16 hour race.

Why do an urban rogaine? They've got some answers from previous Bremerton participants. For rogaine veteran Curtis Condon it was "a training run and a way to get quality family time." Sue Williams found it a chance to gather landscaping ideas and get her mind off work. Locals learned new things about their city. "[The course] kept pointing to things I'd never taken notice to ... it was an eye opener," said Eric Brown, a Boy Scout from Bremerton. Eugen Groff, member of the winning team, was in it for the challenge. "We decided to shoot for ALL the controls and our only strategy was to cover the whole route as fast as possible."

An exciting lineup is developing for the 16 hour division of the Night & Day. One team includes Dean Vergillo, member of the winning Bremerton team.

Another is a pair of accomplished ultra-marathoners who have never orienteered. Still other teams include experienced rogainers. Can ultra runners out-rogaine orienteers in an urban environment? Come be part of this exciting race!

Seattle summers are spectacular--warm but rarely hot, never humid, with crisp clean air and sunshine sparkling off the waters all around. See their website for more Night & Day details.
