Jan 10 Scrabble-O at Coon Bluff

Join us Saturday, **January 10th**, at the Coon Bluff Recreation Area. Develop your land navigation skills, compete for best score, or just enjoy a day outside! Everyone must be off the course by 1:00 PM when the course closes. Competitors will <u>all</u> start at 10:30.

This event is a **Scrabble-O** type of event where each control you find has a letter and point value. Find as many controls as you can, in any order, in the time allowed, and when you are done, put your words on a Scrabble board for maximum point value. You'll want to strategize to get the best letter combinations in the time you have. Official rules will be posted on the website and at the meet

Directions to Coon Bluff From Phoenix:

Take US 60 (Superstition Freeway) east to Power Road, exit #188. Turn north onto Power Road. The turnoff to Coon Bluff is on the north side of the road, about 12 3/4 miles from US60. Look for an orange/white orienteering bag on the south side (about 1 mile past the Phon D. Sutton Recreation Area turnoff). Turn left and drive about 1.25 miles to the parking area. Look for an orange/white O bag at the registration table. If you get to Usery Pass Road, turn around and go back about 1.25 miles and turn right.

What to bring: water bottle(s), whistle (required; available for \$1), compass (some available to rent for \$1), your lunch, a lawn chair, etc.

Jan 18: Field Checking at Needle Vista - First Water

The next scheduled field checking for the Needle Vista - First Water Map will be on **Sunday, January 18**. Please note that this is a change from the previously scheduled date of January 17. There will be a fairly informal three day fiesta of orienteering in the Anza-Borrego Desert over Martin Luther King Day weekend January 17-19.
